

East Sandy Elementary School Community Council was pleased to be able to spend \$56,577 of LAND Trust funds on East Sandy Mustangs for the 2019 - 20 school year.

\$56,577 of LAND Trust funds on East Sandy Mustangs for the 2019 - 20 school year. It was determined that funds should be spent on reading and technology. To increase reading achievement students were identified as performing below benchmark on Acadience testing. Students identified received daily intervention support from intervention assistants under the direction of the achievement coach. Most of the allocated School Land Trust funding, \$44,050, was used to hire two assistants to provide reading interventions. A total of \$2,000 was spent on substitutes. They were utilized so teachers could collaborate to review student data, identify students needs and plan Rtl instruction. Literacy programs, costing \$5,000, were purchased to be used in skill-based instruction and literacy practice stations. Technology devices were purchased for skill-based instruction and literacy practice stations for \$5,527. East Sandy is close to 1:1 technology across the school. The East Sandy SCC sees our LAND Trust Plan resources as a crucial component of our student achievement. It also helps that East Sandy teachers are simply the BEST!



East Sandy's Teacher Student Success Plan Goals for 2020 - 2021

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

- By May of 2021
 - 90% of *Kindergarten* students will make typical or above typical growth in PSF (Phoneme Segmentation Fluency) from MOY to EOY as measured by Acadience Pathways of Progress.
 - 60% first grade students will make typical or above typical growth on Acadience Pathways of Progress for a Composite Score from Fall Benchmark to Spring Benchmark.
 - 60% second grade students will make typical or above typical growth on Acadience Pathways of Progress for a Composite Score from Fall Benchmark to Spring Benchmark.

- 60% third grade students will make typical or above typical growth on Acadience Pathways of Progress for a Composite Score from Fall Benchmark to Spring Benchmark.
- 85% of *fourth grade* will gain 100 points, at minimum, or maintain a level higher than 770, on the Reading Inventory (RI) from the Fall Benchmark to Spring Benchmark.
- *fifth grade* will improve RI scores from the Fall to Spring Benchmarks in the following groups:
 - 80% of students who are at or above benchmark will improve their scores by at least 50 points.
 - 80% of the students who are below or well below will make the yearly growth of 75 points.
